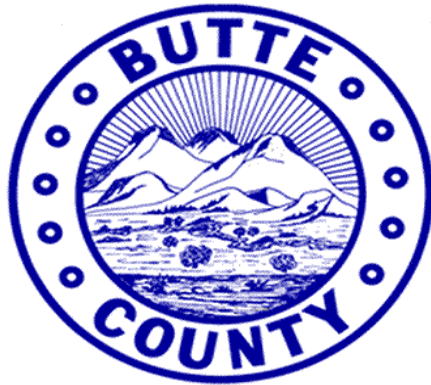

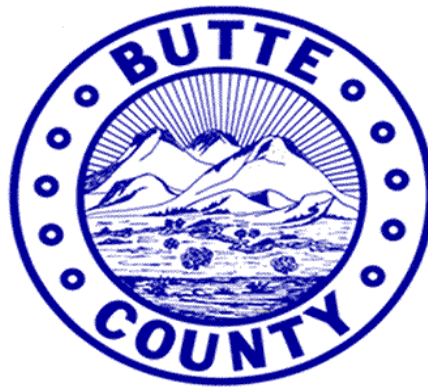

Formation Description:	Formed in accordance with Public Utilities Code Section 21670 and Butte County City Selection Committee Resolution No. 84-2 dated June 28, 1984. This Committee was formed by Butte County Resolution No. 04-057 as a result of the approval of Senate Bill 621 which established a method for distributing funds from the Indian Gaming Special Distribution Fund to local government agencies impacted by tribal gaming. In accordance with Government Code Sections 12710-12718, an Individual Tribal Casino Account has been established by the State Controller for each casino paying into the Special Distribution Fund. This Committee shall remain in effect only until January 1, 2009, and as of that date, the Committee and its authority are dissolved, unless a later enacted state statute that is enacted before January 1, 2009 deletes or extends that date.

Function / Purpose:

The Committee is established pursuant to Paragraph (1) of subsection (b) of Section 12715 of the California Government Code. It is the responsibility of the Committee to facilitate the distribution of appropriations from the Indian Gaming Distribution Fund by selecting those grants from each Individual Tribal Account or County Tribal Casino Account that will be applied toward the support of local government agencies within the County impacted by tribal government gaming.

Structure / Appointment of Members:

The Committee shall be composed of five (5) members consisting of the following, or as may be otherwise required by law:

- a. Two (2) representatives from the County, appointed by the County Board of Supervisors;
- b. Three (3) elected representatives from cities located within four (4) miles of a tribal casino in the County, appointed by the County Board of Supervisors based upon nominations from the City Council(s). In the event that there are no cities within four (4) miles of a tribal casino in the County, other local representatives may be selected upon mutual agreement by the County Board of Supervisors and a majority of the tribes in the County paying into the Indian Gaming Fund. However, if only one city is within four (4) miles of a tribal casino and that same casino is located entirely within the unincorporated area of that particular county, only one elected representative from that city shall be included on the Indian Gaming Local Community Benefit Committee;
- c. Two (2) representatives selected upon the recommendation of a majority of the tribes paying into the Indian Gaming Special Distribution Fund in the County. If there are no tribes in the County paying into the Indian Gaming Special Distribution Fund, the two representatives may be selected upon the recommendation of the tribes operating casinos in the County.

Terms:

Terms of office of the members shall be four years expiring on June 30 of the appropriate years and subsequent new terms shall begin July 1 of that year. The first term of office shall be deemed to commence on July 1, 2004 only for purposes of subsequent appointment of members. (For all other purposes,

Formation Description: The Committee was formed pursuant to Resolution No. 96-43 with the intent to allow local agencies, school districts and the public to participate in reviewing the policies that guide the investment of public funds by the County Treasurer under Ordinance No. 3265. The mandate for the existence of the Committee was suspended in 2004 by the State of California; however, the Committee serves an important function and the Treasurer's Office has elected to continue the program. Current conditions support modification of the By-Laws established in 2000 to allow for increased flexibility and reduction in costs. New By-Laws were adopted as of October 13, 2009.

Butte County offers a voluntary deferred compensation program, pursuant to IRS regulation 457, for employees. 457 Plans are non-qualified, unfunded deferred compensation plans, which is the reason why the assets generated by the existence of such plans are solely the property of the employer, subject to the claims of the employer's general creditors. The IRS has accepted a method of providing limited insulation of deferred compensation assets from claims of employer creditors under a 457 plan without affecting the tax deferred status of such accounts. This method (called a "Rabbi Trust") establishes an irrevocable trust and establishes a trust investment committee endowed with power separate and apart from the employer. This results in a situation in which the trust assets (employee's deposits) could not be used for purposes other than those designated by the trustee committee. While the trust will protect employee's deposits from claims of its creditors, it does not protect assets in the event of bankruptcy. The Deferred Compensation Committee believes that by establishing the trust, employees deposits will benefit by the additional protection against claims filed by creditors.

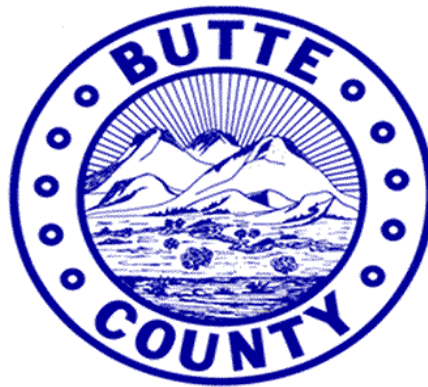

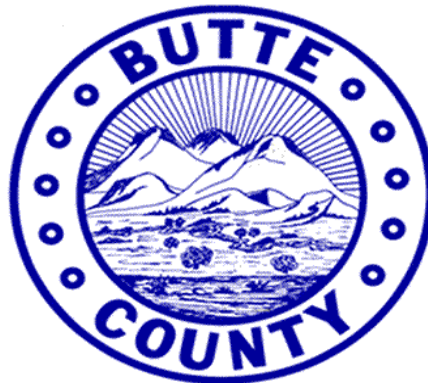
