### 3.00 **Agenda**

3.01 Overview: The Feather River Ranger District (FRRD) of the Plumas National Forest (PNF) has established a Collaborators group, holding meetings quarterly. The FRRD has been approached by Sierra Pacific Industries (SPI) with a proposal to consider potential land swaps to resolve long standing issues regarding public access through SPI lands. Some of the SPI lands now have gated roads that close off historical access routes to public lands. The FRRD wants the public to identify and evaluate the priority routes, identify all recreational uses of import and put together a list and maps in a comprehensive fashion. Public lands under consideration in this project include those in the Lassen National Forest (LNF), some of which are managed by the PNF. The FRRD will coordinate with the LNF as appropriate on this endeavor.

3.02 Identify county, Forest Service and private access roads, show gates and other access issues on maps

3.03 Identify SPI parcels aligned with blocked access

3.04 Identify USFS lands within SPI property. Identify those that currently have a lower priority for public access
