Ethic Law and Training Plan

Government Code 53234 of California AB 1234 requires specified local officials to receive two hours of public service ethics laws and principles training. The requirement applies to local officials who either receive compensation for their service, or are reimbursed for their expenses. For newly elected and appointed officials, the requirement is to receive this training within one year of assuming office; for everyone else, the requirement is to receive this training within two years of receiving one's first training.

Richvale Recreation & Park District officers who have yet to fulfill this requirement will do so through training classes offered locally, or through the Attorney General's online training, free of charge, found at <http://www.caag.state.ca.us>.

Records of the dates that the officers satisfied the requirements, as well as the entity that provided the training, will be maintained by the district, and are accessible to the public by a verbal or written request to the Richvale Recreation & Park District.
