

# **Community Corrections Partnership (CCP)**

## **Meeting Minutes**

November 16, 2016

### **I. CALL TO ORDER**

- a. Chief Probation Officer, Steven Bordin, called the regular meeting of the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) to order at 9:00 a.m., on November 16, 2016, in the Butte County Office of Education's (BCOE) board room located at 1859 Bird Street, Oroville, California.
- b. Review of previous committee minutes from September 21, 2016. Chief Bordin asked for a motion to approve; a first was given by Ron Reed and a second by Kory Honea. All were in favor and the motion passes.

### **II. SUB-GROUP COMMITTEE REPORTS/UPDATES**

#### **BUTTE COUNTY PROBATION**

- Dwayne Martin, Program Manager, reported out Probation's PCS statistics covering the first four months of FY 16/17. A handout was provided.

#### **BUTTE COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE**

- Lt. Hovey gave an update on the ACS, JAG grant, Job Fair and the Sheriff's Second Change K-9 program, etc.
- Lt. Agurkis gave an update on the jail's population. He reports their in-custody classes are going well. They are also looking at jail based treatment for their 1368 individuals; who are a "Competency to Stand Trial" individual.
- Sheriff Honea spoke about the California Forensic Medial Group (CFMG) collaboration with Behavioral Health. He reported their first dual client responded well to the Vivitrol pilot program and has since been released and continuing treatment.

#### **BUTTE COUNTY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH**

- Scott Kennelly, Assistant Director, reported out his department's statistics, covering October 2015 thru October 2016. Mr. Kennelly reports things seem to be stable with regard to referrals. Mr. Kennelly also reported that they have a second client in the Vivitrol pilot program who continues to show up for treatment. A handout was provided.

#### **BUTTE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYMENT AND SOCIAL SERVICES**

- Cathi Grams, Director have a brief report on her department's statistics. She reports a slight decline in the eligibility numbers. She also informed the CCP members that Shelby Boston will be the new Director at DESS upon her retirement.

#### **BUTTE COUNTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY**

#### **OTHER PROGRAMS REPORTING**

- Probation Officer Amy Asher gave a brief report regarding the Job Fair and also on Probation and Community Services (PAC).
- Chief Bordin announced to the CCP members the promotion of Jennifer Hard to the Program Manager for the Treatment Unit.
- Supervising Probation Officer Mike Rogers gave a brief report regarding the Re-Entry Program, year to date.

#### **SUB-GROUPS/COMMITTEES**

#### **UPDATES/DISCUSSION**

- Chief Bordin reported out on the Prop 47 Grant. Jennifer Hard to research how the grant process works. Possible funding can be up to \$1 million.
- Chief Bordin reported on the 'Stepping up Together' Conference which will be addressing jail and mental health issues. The conference will be in January. Chief Bordin has opened the registration to allow partners to participate. This is a collaborative, day and a half conference in Sacramento.
- Chief Bordin spoke about the Community Based Transitional Housing Grant; stating there are "housing issues" for our populations. There will be a conference call 11/18/16.
- Chief Bordin talked about the Transitional Age Youth, SB1004 was signed by the Governor and will begin on 1/1/17. This bill is a pilot program involving 5 counties, of which Butte County is one. This is for 18-21 year old adult felony offenders from jail and the adult system going back into the juvenile system. Would like to convene an advisory committee to meet after the CCP meetings. He will need about 5 persons from the CCP to sit with him after the regular meeting adjourns.
- A brief discussion took place as to where to hold future CCP meetings. Cathi Grams offered the Tahoe Room at 202 Mira Loma for the January, March and May 2017 meetings. The July, September and November 2017 meetings will be back at BCOE.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

- Sean Farrell, Director of Child Support Services introduced himself to the CCP members and stated that some of his staff attends the PAC meetings, DRC, etc. He is interested in exploring opportunities to strengthen his department's partnerships with the community.

- Ron Reed briefly spoke about a report that was released by CDCR's Office of Research, – "2015 Outcome Evaluation Report." He states it is a pretty encouraging report; they've studied those that have left prison over the last three year period; showing a 44% recidivism rate overall.
- Richard Holst, Deputy CEO from Butte County Superior Court introduced himself to the CCP members; he stated he will be taking over from Beverly Gilbert when she retires.
- Tim Taylor of BCOE spoke to the members regarding the loss of two students over the weekend and would like to close the meeting in the memory of Danny and Charlie.
