

# **Community Corrections Partnership (CCP)**

## **Meeting Minutes**

May 18, 2016

### **I. CALL TO ORDER**

- a. Chief Probation Officer, Steven Bordin, called the regular meeting of the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) to order at 9:10 a.m., on March 16, 2016, in the Butte County Office of Education's board room located at 1859 Bird Street, Oroville, California.
- b. Review of previous committee minutes from March 16, 2016. Chief Bordin asked for a motion to approve the minutes; a first was given by Ron Reed and seconded by Dorian Kittrell. All were in favor and the motion passes.

### **II. SUB-GROUP COMMITTEE REPORTS/UPDATES**

- Program Manager, Dwayne Martin of the Butte County Probation Department reported on CCP/Probation Data as of May 18, 2016. Starts and transfers of the PCS population in the first 10 months of the program (FY 15/16), were 178 people. Closes were 158; increasing approximately 2 per month on average. Current point in time population was 367 (May 5, 2016). The Mandatory Supervision (MS) population in the same 10 months, started 78 people on MS; closed out 43 and during that time they increased about 4 per month on average. Current point in time population is 111; increased by 50 as of May 5, 2016.
- Lt. Hovey of the Butte County Sheriff's Office reported out on the Alternative Custody Supervision (ACS) population; he states they have 113 participants in the program with 78 of those who are involved in programming, with another 31 who are amongst the work crews. He further stated as of last year, the work crews have contributed over 26,000 man-hours to the community. The Second Chance Dog Program is going well and pending another adoption. Sgt. Lyon of the Butte County Sheriff's Office reported there are 586 persons in custody as of May 18, 2016.

- Dorian Kittrell, Director of Butte County Behavioral Health reports they are steady at 118 participants; with a little under 7% of those are on medication support. He further reports his department's stats are pretty much the same as last month.
- Cathi Grams, Director of Butte County Department Employment and Social Services reported they have 187 participants enrolled in employment programs and there about 240 clients who are receiving some kind of public assistance such as, Cal-Fresh, General Assistance. Of note, she states there has been a decline in Medi-Cal and Cal-Fresh applications over the last couple of months and they are not sure why.
- Chief Bordin reported that Probation has had 4 graduates from the Re-Entry program and all 4 are employed. It has been successful to this point.
- Chief Bordin asked for any active sub-committee reports. There were none.
- Chief Bordin gave a brief update on AB109 and the May Revise; no major changes at this point. We are still slated to receive the same amount of funding that has been anticipated in the budget process.
- Dorian Kittrell spoke about loss of funds to his department due to a new bill taking 7% of MHSA funds and then another 1%; the total will be a \$900,000 to \$1 million dollar loss annually for the next 30 years. This will affect some programming. With respect to the AB109 program, which is co-located with their Alcohol and Drug program on Rio Lindo in Chico; the lease will be up this December 31<sup>st</sup>. They will be moving their Alcohol and Drug program to the old Enloe Hospital; but, there is not enough room for the AB109 program to be housed there – which is approximately 5 individuals. He would like to make a proposal after the first of the year for the CCP to give Behavioral Health \$150,000 which will let them secure a new lease somewhere in the vicinity of Chico Probation and Community Services. Also, he stated they will need to add a Medical Records Technician with those funds.
- Amy Asher of Chico Probation and Community Services gave a brief update on the Employment Fair; they are looking at November 2<sup>nd</sup> in the fall, from 9-1. The Silver Dollar fair grounds will not be available at this time of year due to the Four Winds School being in session. The committee has come up with the Chico Masonic Lodge as a possible venue. The cost is \$500. The committee is asking they be allowed to move forward with the time and date. Chief Bordin said this will be an action item for the next CCP meeting and it will be put on the agenda.
