### ***MEASLES CASES IN BUTTE COUNTY CONTINUE TO INCREASE***

BUTTE COUNTY, Calif. – Butte County Public Health (BCPH) officials remind residents that the measles outbreak still continues in Butte County. BCPH has confirmed one additional cases of measles in an adult, bringing the total cases in Butte County to 7. These cases are linked to the original measles cluster announced on March 24<sup>th</sup>.

**Measles public exposure locations in Chico and Oroville have been identified for this case, however, this investigation is ongoing and more locations will be added:**

- **Oroville** – Butte County Assessor Office, 25 County Center Drive #100, on Tuesday, April 9, 2019 from 2:07-3:09 pm
- **Oroville** – Butte County Recorder's Office, 155 Nelson Ave., on Tuesday, April 9, 2019 from 2:24-3:40 pm
- **Chico** – The office of Dr. Madeline Holzman, 572 Rio Lindo Suite 201, on Tuesday, April 9, 2019 from 3:15-4:17 pm

**If you were present at any of these locations during the indicated time-frame and believe you may have been exposed, especially if you are ill with a fever, rash, cough, runny nose or red watery eyes, you can call (530) 552-3929 to speak with Public Health staff.**

Everyone can help prevent the spread of measles by checking their vaccination status, getting vaccinated if needed, monitoring themselves and their families for symptoms, and cooperating with public health professionals if you are contacted about your or your family's vaccination history and whereabouts. If you think you have symptoms of measles - **Immediately call your doctor** and let him or her know about your symptoms you are having. DO NOT go to a clinic, hospital or physician's office before calling their facility and do not go into public places to prevent spreading the disease to others. Your doctor can:

- Determine if you are immune to measles based on your vaccination record or if you had measles in the past, and
- Make special arrangements to evaluate you, if needed, without putting other patients and medical office staff at risk.
