HAIR SALONS AND BARBERSHOPS MAY REOPEN IN BUTTE COUNTY WITH LOCAL AND STATE MITIGATION MEASURES

BUTTE COUNTY, Calif. – As of Tuesday, May 26, 2020, counties that have attested to meeting the criteria for accelerated re-opening may reopen hair salons and barbershops. County specific and State guidelines and mitigation measures should be implemented before these businesses may reopen.

In addition to the State's guidance to reopen, salons and barbers should follow additional [mitigation measures issued by Butte County](#) to protect the public's health:

- Maintain a log for the previous 14 days including customer name and contact information, time of appointment, and stylist/employee who had close contact so the log may be provided to Butte County Public Health for the purposes of contact tracing.
- Note: Any haircut will be considered close contact for the purposes of contact tracing regardless of duration.
- Suspend Walk-in Appointments.
- Implement virtual check-in technology to ensure that workers are notified when a customer arrives. Ask customers to wait outside or in their cars or at home rather than congregating in the salon or barbershop. In larger locations, reception areas should only have one customer at a time or modify the area for adequate physical distancing, including removing chairs and sofas.

Once hair salons and barbershops have reviewed the guidance and implemented all mitigation measures, they should print and display the [Butte County Self-Certification Window Placard](#) near the entrance to their business.
