

CALIFORNIA'S FOOD HANDLER CERTIFICATION CARD

Food handlers must have a California Food Handler Card. Employees have 30 days from the date of hire to obtain a food handler card. The cards must be provided to your employer and a copy kept on file. Cards are valid throughout most of the state and are valid for three (3) years.



Who is a food handler? A food handler is a person who is involved in the preparation, storage, or service of food in a food facility.

The definition includes most restaurant employees, such as those holding the positions of, but not limited to: wait staff, chefs, head cooks, cooks, bussers, bartenders, hosts and hostesses who handle food, and supervisory personnel, such as the general manager or managers.
