New Waste and Recycling Services coming to Butte County

With California establishing a statewide goal of 75% diversion of material away from landfills, Butte County anticipates additional mandates for further diversion to be forthcoming. As Butte County prepares for added directives to meet these new mandates for diversion and recycling, starting March 1, we will organize the unincorporated parts of the County into specific service areas for the collection of waste and recyclables. This allows the waste haulers, as well as the County, to operate more efficiently and therefore add more services to meet the new State mandates. This program of more efficient collection operations will provide benefits to County residents.



Benefits include:

Sustainability

- Less trash/recycling trucks on the road.
- Less wear and tear on those roads.

- Less greenhouse gas emissions.
- Stable funding source for the Neal Road Recycling and Waste Facility and the Butte Regional Household Hazardous Waste Facility and will allow Butte County to develop additional renewable energy projects.

Additional services

- Recycling and green waste collection will be part of basic collection services in the 6 recycling zones within the County.
- Bulky item collection - On-call pickup of 5 bulky items per year.

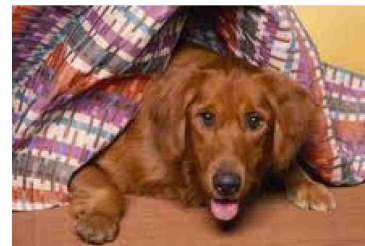


Notre Dame School recycles to be able to recycle even more
