



Valley View Apartments is taking applications. In order to be eligible to apply for residency, the first step in the process is for each applicant to receive certification from Butte County Department of Behavioral Health verifying MHSA eligibility and homelessness or at risk of homeless.

Valley View Apartments

Valley View Apartments provides permanent supportive housing for Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) eligible adults 18 years and older with serious mental illness who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. The apartment complex includes 14 one-bedroom units, an on-site manager's unit, community room, laundry, and building space to assist with educational and vocational support programs for residents.

Target Population

The target population is defined as MHSA eligible adults, ages 18 years and older with serious mental illness who, at the time of assessment for housing services, meet the definition of homeless or at risk of homelessness (as defined by the MHSA Housing Program). The permanent supportive housing complex will offer affordable housing for eligible residents benefitting from mental health services linked with housing.

Each MHSA Housing Program unit must have a lease signed by all adult members of the household, and be occupied by at least one MHSA eligible resident.

To Begin the Eligibility Application Process*

MHSA Eligibility and Homeless and At Risk of Homelessness Certification

The application process will begin at the Butte County Department of Behavioral Health Housing Program to verify MHSA eligibility and homeless or at risk of homelessness status. Interested applicants should read and complete the attached documents:

1. MHSA Housing Program Eligibility Requirements
2. MHSA Program Letter of Interest
3. MHSA Housing Program Referral and Certification Form

Documents are available for pick-up at all outpatient centers at the front desk. Documents are available in English and Spanish on the BCDBH website.

Applicants must complete the MHSA Letter of Interest and MHSA Certification and Referral Form and provide sufficient documentation to be valid (third party verification letters for income, homelessness or at risk of homelessness).

BCDBH Housing Program will provide assistance to applicants and referring agencies with the MHSA eligibility and tenant application process. BCDBH Housing Program will submit certifications for eligible prospective residents to Northern Valley Catholic Social Service Property Management to begin the tenant selection process.
