OBSERVATIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS:

- 33- Generally clean countertops, under equipment and in other hard to reach areas, of residues, etc.
- 39- Replace missing thermometer in hamburger freezer (27° F) and walk-in freezer; and broken thermometer in walk-in cooler (40° F).
- 45- a) Resecure upraised walk-in freezer door threshold so as to facilitate cleaning and prevent trip and fall hazard. Replace damaged door seal on walk-in freezer door.
- b) Replace broken/ missing floor tiles. RegROUT floor, where grout has eroded out more than 1/8 inch in between floor tiles.
- c) Replace/ resecure loose wall trim strips/ FRP wall panels in prep area and near drive-thru window.
- d) Ceiling observed leaking near walk-in freezer door—check and repair leak as needed.
- e) Clean floors, in hard to reach areas, of some residues, etc. (ie: below beverage dispenser at drive-thru window area).

Reinspection fees will be charged for all subsequent reinspection unless an acceptable corrective time schedule has been submitted and approved by this Department.
