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OBSERVATIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS

6, 41- Replace missing knee peddle for cold water at handsink or provide tempered water (100° F) through existing knee peddle, rather than just hot (120° F) water at handsink.

35- Repair leaking walk-in cooler condenser. Remove container of water on top shelf in walk-in cooler (under condenser).

38- a) Replace screening and shower curtain in window opening between kitchen and back room with an openable, screened window or as otherwise directed by State Health Dept.

b) Provide plastic coated light bulb or cover over exiting light in walk-in cooler.

41- Route walk-in cooler condenser drain line into planted area rather than onto concrete walk-way at entrance to facility. Provide screening over open end of drain line.

48- Submit plan check application and fees for remodel for newly installed walk-in cooler. Check with City of Chico for their requirements.
