**OBSERVATIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS:** 5, 6- No paper towels at restroom or kitchen hand sinks and common towels in use. Obtain paper towels, place in sanitary dispensers and discontinue use of common towels to prevent spread of bacteria and/or viruses.

30- Observed uncovered bulk flour container (under roller) and unsealed bags of bakery mixes (on prep table). Seal/cover to prevent contamination, infestation and/or harborages.

36- Observed still water in bottom of container storing ice scoops. Keep water drained to prevent bacterial growth. Secure CO2 tanks to rigid structure.

38- Observed missing shatterproof light covers over utensil sink, mixer and fryer. Replace.

Reinspection fees will be charged for all subsequent reinspections unless an acceptable corrective time schedule has been submitted and approved by this Department. If, for any reasons beyond your control, you cannot correct the indicted violations by the next scheduled time, call this office prior to the inspection day.
