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OBSERVATIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS

1- Manager took food safety test recently and is waiting for results at this time.

4- Some employee drink glasses observed without lids.

7- Potatoes (55° F), chorizo (126° F) in steam table at time of inspection. Recommend keeping precooked potatoes cold (in refrigerator) until cooked/ reheated for customer.

10- Food handlers reportedly not checking final temperatures of cooked to order foods (ie: fish)—use digital probe thermometer (available at time of inspection) to check final temperatures of such foods.

14- Obtain a brush for cleaning hard to reach/ clean areas of tomato slicer—some tomato seeds observed on slicer. Slicer is reportedly cleaned before and after use.

27- Some whole, shell eggs stored on shelf above tortillas, potatoes in walk-in cooler.

Note: Grease trap has been installed outside of the food prep area/ building.
