OBSERVATIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: 7- Observed raw salmon (45°F), octopus (48°F), prawns (53°F) and sprouts (50°F) in top of prep refrigerator (air temperature 40°F). Adjust/repair unit to maintain potentially hazardous foods at 41°F or below or store foods in bottom section of prep refrigerator. Observed sushi rice (107°F-110°F) in cooker/holder. Reported sushi rice held with time only but rice not marked with discard time. When Time Only is used to ensure public safety, food containers shall be marked with discard time 4 hours from time food was taken from temperature control. Holding sushi rice at 135°F or above at a pH of 4.5 or below (requires approved pH meter and log) are alternate methods of ensuring public safety.

Reinspection fees will be charged for all subsequent reinspections unless an acceptable corrective time schedule has been submitted and approved by this Department.
