OBSERVATIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: 5- Observed food handler making sushi properly wash hands at hand sink. Violation corrected.
 7- Observed assorted seafood at 44°F-46°F in top of sushi prep refrigerator. Adjust/repair unit to maintain potentially hazardous foods at 41°F or below.
 14, 40- Observed food handler making sushi clean knife by wiping with soiled wiping rag sitting on prep refrigerator cutting board. Properly wash/rinse/sanitize knives at utensil sink whenever cleaning is required. Note: Okay on performance basis to wipe knife with paper towel when working with sushi fish. Paper towel shall be used once and discarded. Knife shall be properly cleaned at utensil sink before using with cooked product (i.e.: toasted eel).

Reinspection fees will be charged for all subsequent reinspection unless an acceptable corrective time schedule has been submitted and approved by this Department.
