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OBSERVATIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS

- 33-** Observed gaps around pipes/conduits in beverage cabinets to be filled-in with copper dish scrubbers. Properly reseal.
- Observed soiled piece of cardboard affixed to coffee condiment counter. Replace cardboard with material that is durable, easily cleanable and non-absorbent.
- 34, 45-** Observed 2-compartment utensil sink. Observed wall panel behind sink to be damaged. Provide approved detergent/sanitizer product (for use with 2-compartment sink) or provide approved 3-compartment utensil sink within next 6 months. Provide approved surface/material (i.e. FRP panels) for walls behind and at end of utensil sink.
- 45-** Clean floors under beverage syrup box rack, utensil sink and water heater to remove dusty residues.
