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OBSERVATIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS

- 13, 14- Containers of unpackaged jerky observed at front counter. Remove unpackaged jerky—there are no facilities (ie: utensil sink) in this store for properly washing utensils (tongs for unpackaged jerky); or provide NSF approved 3-compartment utensil sink for proper utensil washing (submit plans to this Dept. prior to installation of sink).
- 27- Temperatures of potentially hazardous foods (ie: milk, sandwiches, etc) reportedly not being checked at time of delivery.
- 35- a) Replace damaged/ taped door seals to reach-in doors of walk-in cooler.
- b) Remove wood shelves in walk-in cooler—replace with NSF approved metal shelving.
- c) Clean bottom of ice cream freezers of residues/ etc.
- 41- Verify that walk-in cooler condensers drain to an approved indirect sewage connection.
- 43, 6- Cases of alcohol, packages of food and misc. items stored in restroom (some obstructing handsink)—remove these items from the restroom.
- 44- a) Clean up/ organize items in storeroom so as to eliminate clutter and facilitate cleaning (ie: shelf unit near janitorial sink).
- b) Provide hanger for air drying and storage of mop (ie: near janitorial sink).
- 45- a) Clean floors, in hard to reach areas, of misc. debris and some dust accumulation. Clean walk-in ceiling of dust accumulation (near fans).
- b) Repair damaged area of ceiling in restroom and in storeroom (near janitorial sink). Resecure/ replace loose and missing FRP panels on walls and ceiling in walk-in cooler.
- c) Floor is cut up/ deteriorated in walk-in cooler.
