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**OBSERVATIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS**

27, 39- Provide probe thermometer for checking food temperatures. Check temperature of potentially hazardous foods at time of delivery.

32- Provide labels on all bags of ice, made at Hwy 32 Mini Mart. Some bags of ice observed with labels.

34- Provide approved sanitizer for utensil washing. Replace missing utensil sink drain plug.

Note: No dishes being washed at time of inspection.

35- Clean cappuccino machines (mixing chambers) of some residues and food debris every 4 hours rather than reportedly less frequently.

41- Route utensil sink drain line to an approved indirect sewage connection (ie: floor sink) rather than into janitorial floor basin.

44- Clean up/ organize storeroom—remove unused items so as to eliminate clutter and facilitate cleaning.

45- a) Clean floor, under shelves in walk-in cooler, of some misc. debris. Clean ceiling/ upper walls in ice machine room of cobwebs.

b) Provide a self-coved floor in utensil washing room. Seal up hole in wall below utensil sink.
