OBSERVATIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: 14- Food handler reports utensil cleaning procedure of wash and rinse with sanitizer. Proper utensil cleaning procedure is 1. Wash with hot, soapy water, 2. Rinse with clear water, 3. Sanitize with approved sanitizer, 4. Air dry on clean drain board.

29- Observed containers Raid and Hot Shot on shelf in back room. Remove domestic insecticide from facility.

30- Observed tomato and pineapple juices stored in opened cans. Store juice in approved, easily cleanable containers once opened.

35- Replace existing ice bins with approved ice bins with integrated cold plates. Observed standing water/rust in bottom of slide top refrigerator. Repair to maintain dry interior. Clean inside beverage gun holders to remove accumulated residues.

36- Observed clean wiping rags stored in cardboard boxes on floor in back room. Place in easily cleanable containers and store off ground.

44- Secure CO2 tanks to rigid structure.

If, for any reasons beyond your control, you cannot correct the indicted violations by the next scheduled time, call this office prior to the inspection day.
