- 35) Clean hood baffles to remove grease buildup. Replace the missing handle on the door of the prep refrigerator. Defrost the walk-in freezer to remove excessive ice buildup at door and ceiling.
- 38) Replace the missing light cover in the wait station.
- 45) Replace the missing and cracked floor tiles in the walk-in freezer. Continue to clean floors in hard to reach areas (especially under cookline and prep refrigerator) to remove food/misc. debris. Repair the damaged wall above the cookline.
