**OBSERVATIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS:**

- 6) No soap or paper towels in sanitary dispensers in bar. Bar hand sinks were not accessible for hand washing. At least one hand sink in the bar must be accessible and maintained.
- 14, 40) Wiping rags are being used for cleaning and sanitizing knives and for wiping down cutting boards. Only dedicated wiping rags in clearly labeled sanitizing solutions may be used for wiping down continuous use food contact surfaces such as the cutting boards on the prep refrigerators. Wiping rags shall **not** be used for cleaning and sanitizing continuous-use food contact surfaces every 4 hours, or for cleaning and sanitizing utensils between different types of foods. Do not leave wiping rags lying on equipment.
- 34) Wash water in bar utensil sink was 82°F. Maintain minimum 100°F hot water in wash compartment of utensil sink.
- 45) Clean floors of misc. debris in hard-to-reach areas such as under and around equipment and around floor sinks.

Reinspection fees will be charged for all subsequent reinspections unless an acceptable corrective time schedule has been submitted and approved by this Department. If, for any reasons beyond your control, you cannot correct the indicted violations by the next scheduled time, call this office prior to the inspection day.
