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OBSERVATIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS

30- Observed food stored in open #10 can in back refrigerator. Store canned foods in food grade container with tight fitting cover once opened.

31- Clean behind nozzles of beverage machine to remove residues.

35- Observed standing water/dust/debris on top of dishwasher. Clean and repair.

36- Observed pan used as scoop in 5 gallon bucket of salsa and handled cup used as scoop sinking into 5 gallon bucket of sour cream (back refrigerator). Provide handled scoop for salsa and store cup in scour cream bucket so as to keep handle out of sour cream.

39- No thermometers observed in prep refrigerator or under counter refrigerator across from dishwasher. Provide.

40- Observed a few wiping rags on food contacts surfaces in kitchen and prep area. Store wiping rags in container of approved sanitizer between uses.

44- Observed mop stored in mop bucket. Store mop so as to dry completely between uses. Secure CO2 tanks (by front hand sink) to rigid structure.

45- Observed a few broken/damaged floor tiles in back room. Repair to be smooth and easily cleanable.
