OBSERVATIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS:

- 14- Wash, rinse and then sanitize utensils in an approved sanitizer (ie: 1 ounce bleach in 4 gal water) rather than sometimes just washing and rinsing utensils.
- 21- No bacteriological water sample results received by this Dept. for this facility for the 1st or 2nd quarter of this year. Take 3rd quarter water sample for testing by Sept 30th.
- As this facility is on a private well, quarterly bacteriological water samples shall be taken and results submitted to this Dept. Take annual nitrate water sample and submit results to this Dept. Contact Elaine McSpadden at Butte Co. Environmental Health with any questions about water samples/ testing.
- Note: Orange juice machine (reportedly not being used at this time) observed on prep counter. Contact this Dept. for requirements prior to beginning making of orange juice.

Reinspection fees will be charged for all subsequent reinspections unless an acceptable corrective time schedule has been submitted and approved by this Department. If, for any reasons beyond your control, you cannot correct the indicted violations by the next scheduled time, call this office prior to the inspection day.
