OBSERVATIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS:

- 33- Clean counters, under rubber netting, of some sticky residues. Clean/ organize back bar cabinets where needed.
- 35- Clean major equipment (ie: bottom of beer cooler, inside, top of ice machine, etc) of some residues, etc.
- 38- Provide an approved overhead light in janitorial room. Check ceiling vent in janitorial room and repair cover as needed.
- 39- Replace missing thermometer in beer cooler (41° F).
- 43- Clean employee restroom.
- 44- Provide a mop hanger for air drying/ storage of mop in between uses.
- 45- Clean floor, in hard to reach areas, of some residues and misc. debris.

Reinspection fees will be charged for all subsequent reinspections unless an acceptable corrective time schedule has been submitted and approved by this Department. If, for any reasons beyond your control, you cannot correct the indicted violations by the next scheduled time, call this office prior to the inspection day.
