- 6- No soap/sanitary soap dispenser at prep sink used as hand sink. Provide.
Note: It is understood that prep sink may only be used as a hand sink as it is reportedly never used for the cleaning or rinsing of foods.
- 30- Observed boxed foods (Pop Tarts, breakfast bars, etc.) being stored on ground in storeroom or on wooden pallets approximately 2 inches off floor. Remove unapproved wooden pallets. Store foods at least six inches off floor on approved shelving (i.e.: dunnage racks, storage racks).
- 33- Clean shelves throughout kitchen to remove dust/debris.
- 34- Observed sanitary soap and paper towel dispensers on wall over utensil sink. Remove. Utensil sink shall be used for utensil cleaning only.
- 35- Observed unused equipment (dishwasher, large mixer, etc.) throughout facility. Remove/relocate to facilitate cleaning.
- 36- Clean inside drawers storing clean utensils to remove rusty residues.
- 45- Observed missing coving behind new utensil sink and damaged floor tile by back door. Replace. Observed damaged wall behind utensil sink and worn paint on walk-in refrigerator floor. Repair to be smooth and easily cleanable.
