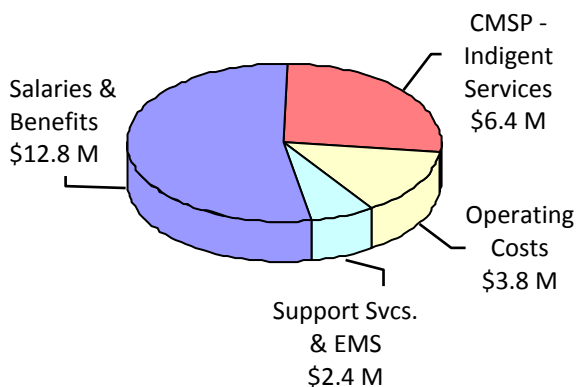




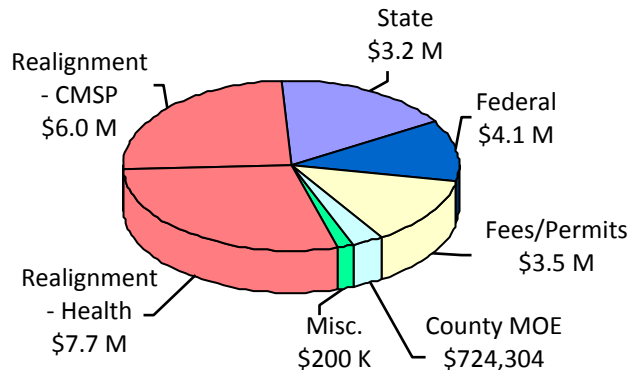
# PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT **POINTS OF INTEREST** 2010

- Public Health contains 4 Divisions that provide an array of services in 35 programs:
  - 1) **Nursing Services** – 13 programs plus 2 PH Clinics and 2 Medical Therapy Units
  - 2) **Communicable Disease / Emergency Response** – 8 programs including PH Lab
  - 3) **Environmental Health** – 7 programs
  - 4) **Administration** – 3 programs including Animal Control and CMSP
  
- 159 FTE Public Health Employees
  
- FY 2010/11 Department Budget: \$25.4 million

**REVENUES**



- \$7.3 million in State and Federal funding is received under 24 contracts to provide public health services.
  
- \$3.5 million in fees collected for Environmental Health, PH Clinic, Laboratory and Vital Statistics services.
  
- \$724,304 in County General Funds are provided from County general funds to meet a requirement known as Maintenance of Effort (MOE) – the County must contribute this amount in order to receive \$12.8 million in Health Realignment revenue.

## MAJOR HIGHLIGHTS

### 2010

#### Nursing Services

- **Home Nursing** – made 1,480+ home visits to case manage medical services and referrals, distributed 234 food vouchers to needy seniors
- **California Children's Services** – case managed 816 active cases for services to children with special health care needs; provided school-based occupational/physical therapy to 173 children
- **WIC Supplemental Food Program** – provided nutrition education & food vouchers to 7,275 low-income women and children per month; supported 28% of mothers in exclusively breastfeeding their infants compare to the statewide average of 19.2%
- **PH Clinics** – conducted over 13,000 visits at 2 clinics; over 4,000 immunizations given; provided meth/addiction recovery case management to over 100 referrals; 40 active opiate treatment patients
- **Dental Services** – provided dental screenings, treatment and education to preschool children and parents in collaboration with Feather River Tribal Health
- **Occupant Protection Program** – provided 19 child passenger safety presentations and 32 community car seat classes educating 500 parents and distributing 656 low cost car seats
- **Maternal Child-Adolescent Health** – telephonic case management to 224 pregnant Medi-Cal women; H1N1 vaccine administered to 75 pregnant women

#### Communicable Disease / Emergency Response

- **Pertussis Epidemic** - provided pertussis outbreak mitigation and prevention (disease surveillance, case investigation, treatment, prophylaxis school/student exposure notifications, and media and public education campaign). 19 Tdap vaccination clinics were provided in the form of 7 mass school-based clinics and 12 outreach clinics. Approximately 3,000 doses were given free of charge to the public
- **Communicable Disease Investigation and Surveillance** – conducted investigation and/or surveillance on 802 cases of Chlamydia, 61 cases of Gonorrhea, 291 cases of Hepatitis C, 32 cases of Pertussis, 57 cases of Salmonella, 73 cases campylobacter, 10 cases of Giardiasis, 2 cases of Lyme Disease, 39 possible exposures to rabies (animal bites) and 18 outbreaks
- **Emergency Response** – provided plans, trainings and exercises to activate disaster medical care sites, provided training on explosive device response for medical providers, developed community outreach campaign on emergency preparedness, recruited disaster volunteers, and developed healthcare surge capacity plan
- **PH Laboratory** – conducted over 6,882 tests, including 255 rabies tests

#### Environmental Health Programs

- **Consumer Protection** – made 2,531 food facility inspections, 574 swimming pool inspections
- **Land Use** – 595 permit reviews, 205 complaint investigations, 28 public water system inspections
- **HazMat** – conducted 1,394 hazardous materials inspections, responded to 66 hazmat emergencies, oversaw 3 property cleanups from methamphetamine labs

#### Administration

- **Animal Control** – responded to 323 animal bites, 120 abandoned animal calls, 541 aggressive animal calls, 672 strays, 1009 animals at large, 661 dead animal pick-ups, 149 specimens submitted for rabies testing, 687 animal welfare checks, 284 sick/injured animals, 198 barking dog calls, 1,258 impounded dogs and 2,287 impounded cats
- **Vital Statistics** – issued 2,257 death certificates and 96 birth certificates
