Oroville, CA – The Butte County Board of Supervisors will hold its regular meeting on Tuesday May 24, 2011 at 9:00 a.m. in its chambers located at 25 County Center Drive in Oroville. It should be noted that this is a change from an earlier announcement. After the Board conducts its regular business, it will adjourn and hold an adjourned regular meeting for a hearing on the adoption the Medical Marijuana Cultivation Ordinance at the Butte County Fairgrounds, 199 East Hazel Street in Gridley. The adjourned regular meeting in Gridley will start at 10:30 a.m.
