Director's Report, Scott Kennelly Outreach for Homeless Community</p> <p>Contracts</p> <p>Grant Opportunities</p> <p>Change Team</p> <p>Governor Updates</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There is daily outreach to the pallet shelter and other homeless encampments, including the camp by the Administration offices.</li> <li>• The pallet shelter and other areas have seen an increase in overdoses.</li> <li>• Street drugs are being laced with fentanyl.</li> <li>• For more information regarding the opioid epidemic and fentanyl, please visit: <a href="http://www.buttecountyresponds.org/en/">www.buttecountyresponds.org/en/</a></li> <li>• The Board of Supervisors approved the psychiatrist contracts on 6/14/2022.</li> <li>• There are several grants being pursued to acquire new buildings and expand and beautify other outpatient clinics. The Chico VA building is one of the potential sites we are looking at to move children's services into.</li> <li>• The Change Team presented a plan to the BCDBH Executive to review that would potentially offer the following:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Flex schedules for staff that would include a remote work and in-office hybrid model</li> <li>○ Better onboarding and training for staff</li> <li>○ Improving communication between line staff, middle management and administration.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• The Governor is still pursuing <i>Care Court</i> which is legislation to compel homeless</li> </ul>	

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	<p>individuals with untreated psychotic disorders into care.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Counties have expressed concerns with the timing and some of the language in the bill.</li><li>• There is no funding for Behavioral Health Departments and there is language about Counties being sanctioned if not meeting certain requirements of <i>Care Court</i>.</li><li>• There is not a large enough workforce in the State to support this initiative.</li></ul>
