Reference:

This address within the County of Butte is provided with full-time fire protection by the Butte County Fire Department (BCFD) which is operated by the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) under a co-operative agreement with the County of Butte.

The closest responding station is _____, located approximately _____ miles from the respective residence. Station _____ is a full time staffed station.

The minimum standard response for a residential structure fire within Butte County: One Battalion Chief, one Safety Officer, four career-staffed Fire Engines, one Rescue Squad, two Water Tenders (3000 gallons minimum) and two Volunteer Companies.

The engines responding may be a combination of an ICS Type II Engine (1500 gallons per minute pump, 600 gallons of water) and/or an ICS Type III Engine (500 gallons per minute pump, 500 gallons of water). Each of these apparatus are staffed full time with two firefighters, but augmented to 3 firefighters during peak summer months (usually May to October).

There is/is not a fire hydrant within a 1000 feet of this residence.
