

# **Community Corrections Partnership (CCP)**

## **Meeting Minutes**

January 21, 2015

### **I. CALL TO ORDER**

- a. Chief Probation Officer, Steve Bordin, called the regular meeting of the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) to order at 9:01 a.m., on January 21, 2015, in the training room of the Butte County Sheriff's Office, 33 County Center Drive, Oroville, CA
- b. Review of previous committee minutes from November 13, 2014. Chief Bordin asked for a motion to approve the minutes; a first was given by Sheriff Kory Honea and second was given by Chief Gabriela Tazzari-Dineen – all were in favor and the motion passes.

### **II. SUB-GROUP COMMITTEE REPORTS/UPDATES**

- Chief Deputy Probation Officer Greg Lynch reported to the group that their numbers are consistent which is around 360 people participating in PCS; with a sex-offender component of 22 persons. He doesn't know how Prop 47 will affect things in the future.
- Sheriff Kory Honea reported that Sergeant Agurkis promoted to Lieutenant and will continue to oversee PCS until they can get a Sergeant to replace him. Lieutenant Hovey will be taking over the program part. The non-credit college course started on 1/20/15; K-9 program will start soon—offenders will be trained how to train companion dogs for Veterans. Cal Fire is interested in using inmates for fire/work crews. Lieutenant Hovey reported out on the jail population; he says since Prop 47 does not cite – only showing a small decrease in the jail population. Sheriff Honea asks Parole about the Prop 47 folks and their "Parole Tails".
- Monica O'Neil of Victim Witness reported that her office has hired the Victim Witness Advocate as of 9/29/14, from the one-time AB109 funds. She further reports that they have served over 900 victims from 10/1/14-12/31/14. Ms. O'Neil stated that they receive daily listings from Lieutenant Agurkis regarding the ACS listings in which they scan them and alert any victim that the offender is now released on ACS. They also receive weekly lists for the SWAP folks too; they give the victims the same alerts.

- Cathi Grams, Director of Department of Employment and Social Services stated that as of April 1, 2015, convicted drug felons will no longer be able to receive Cal Fresh benefits. They are now able to take applications for Medi-Cal right in the jail because of regulations have changed; they hold the applications until the offender is released and then they can activate their Medi-Cal. Ms. Grams further reported on the employment side of things, only 22 PCS folks have found employment in a pool of approximately 165. She said she is not sure if they are duplicating efforts with Alliance Workforce. This will be looked into.
- Dorian Kittrell, Director of Behavioral Health reported they now have a half-time clinician at the jail and working – CFMG. Prop 47 is affecting some State Hospital inmates. There are now several clinicians imbedded in Enloe and Feather River Hospital emergency rooms; from 2 to 11 pm. They are still waiting for Oroville Hospital to return the MOU, but, they are still being served by the Crisis Team.
- Chief Bordin reported to the group that BSCC wants more/modified information for the annual report.
- No subcommittee groups to report.
- Louis Jarvis, Management Analyst Senior from the Butte County Administration's office presented a handout with the CCP Budget for the next 3 Fiscal Years (14/15, 15/16, and 16/17). Mr. Jarvis then addressed each item on the handout. Honea asks about SB90 monies (repayment to counties); Andy Pickett explained---the majority of the funds will go to Behavioral Health. Pickett further explains the AB109 budget, with several critical keys: on-going county costs, base allocation and one-time growth funds. Performance as a county impacts how much of the growth funds we will get. Sheriff Honea states that the CCP establish a sub-committee (for understanding the criteria needed); Chief Bordin agrees. It is a small group consisting of: Mike Ramsey, Greg Lynch, Dwayne Martin, Andy Pickett/Louis Jarvis and Jon Caudill. Chief Bordin also told the group that the budget sub-committee needs to reconvene. Sheriff Honea tasks Andy Pickett with contacting those involved.
- Professor Jon Caudill of CSUC gave a brief update regarding the third year review; the data is complex and as soon as it is complete, his team will provide it to the CCP.
