Meeting Minutes

May 20, 2015

I. CALL TO ORDER

- a. Chief Probation Officer, Steve Bordin, called the regular meeting of the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) to order at 9:04 a.m., on May 20, 2015, in the training room of the Butte County Sheriff's Office, 33 County Center Drive, Oroville, CA
- b. Review of previous committee minutes from March 18, 2015. Chief Bordin asked for a motion to approve the minutes; a first was given by Ron Reed and seconded by Gabriela Tazzari-Dineen – all were in favor and the motion passes.

II. SUB-GROUP COMMITTEE REPORTS/UPDATES

--- Dwayne Martin, Program Manager at Butte County Probation reported out Probation's stats with respect to the Post-Release Community Supervision (PCS) Unit. Dwayne reports that by the end of April 2015, 172 people came in this fiscal year, 186 this fiscal year closed out, 15% of those closures were due to Prop 47. Current population at the end of April is 349. Approximately 16% of those are out to warrant. In the Mandatory Supervision population, approximately 33 came in this fiscal year and approximately 43 exited. 19% of those closures are due to Prop 47. The current caseload in the population is 61: with 10% of those out to warrant and are down about 4%.

Mark Cole, Supervisor of the PCS Unit for Butte County Probation, spoke about programming. The job workshop is filled up and doing quite well; with roughly 30 offenders in each one; out of that, roughly 15-17 graduate every month. The MRT groups are being provided by Probation's officers and Behavioral Health (AB109 team). With respect to the residential and recovery residence housing programs, our officers are always out checking on the programs and making sure everything is up to standard.

--- Dorian Kittrell, Director of Butte County Behavioral Health did not have any stats available; but stated he will provide them at a later time.

- Lt. Agurkis reported out for BCSO. The population in the jail is currently at 586. Jail impact fees are now being collected by Chico, Oroville and Paradise. He states he and the Sheriff will be talking to Gridley and Biggs in the near future about collecting these fees also. He further reports that they have 47 individuals from the south facility going to 8 different classes, which is not a lot due to the very limited programming space. Sgt. Lyon reported on the ACS program---fiscally from last July 2014 until May 19, 2015, they have had 220 go to ACS, 539 go to their ACS/DUI program for a total of 759 individuals. July 14 to present; in terms of completions, they have had 95 complete the regular ACS program. 525 complete DUI; currently as of 5/19, they have 89 on regular ACS program and 20 on their DUI program. As of May 4th, the dog program has kicked off and they currently have 4 people from ACS and one volunteer trainer to work with the dogs. BCSO is looking for more training volunteers to help train the dogs in general obedience. Once the dogs are trained, they will be going to Veteran's who have emotional and some physical needs as companion dogs.
- Deanna Abrahamian, Assistant Director of DESS, appeared for Cathi Grams. She did not have any stats to provide, but they will be forthcoming.
- District Attorney Mike Ramsey reported that his office just received their Request for Complaint for 2014; felony and misdemeanors, from all the various police agencies in Butte County—they received 3,747 requests for felony complaints and 5,524 for misdemeanors.
- Andy Pickett of Butte County Administration stated that the CCP budget that was voted on at the last CCP (3/18/15) meeting was incorporated into the county-wide budget that will be presented to the Board of Supervisors on June 23, 2015.
- Chief Bordin reported to the CCP that he did not have anything to report from the legislature.
- Debbie Morris of BCOE spoke to the CCP about the upcoming Job/Employment Faire; they will be using the Butte County Fairgrounds at half price which is \$350, tables and chairs provided. The date will be Thursday, July 16, from 10 to 1. Chief Bordin offered one-time monies from the CCP to BCOE for this job fair, if needed.
