International Travel Health Visit

The travel health visit is an individual session with an experienced travel nurse that utilizes a state of the art web-based information service and includes:

- Review of your travel itinerary and health history
- Assessment of communicable disease risks during your trip
- Recommendations for vaccines and travel medications
- Handouts on staying safe and healthy while traveling, with a variety of information on insect bite protection, altitude illness, water purification, avoiding and managing travelers' diarrhea.

What is required:

- Appointments are required for international travelers.
- There is a fee for the travel health visit. The fee covers the review, assessment, recommendations, and prescription(s). Vaccines are priced individually. Payment is accepted with cash or check, we do not bill insurance, and we do not accept credit cards.
- Please bring your immunization record and list of medications.
- If you complete your registration forms before the visit, it saves time during the clinic visit. The forms are downloadable from the Public Health website at: buttecounty.net/publichealth. Plan to spend 1 ½ hour minimum for this visit.

Travel Vaccines

We administer most vaccines available for international travel, including:

Yellow Fever

- International Certificate of Vaccination
- Or Medical Waiver (see our yellow fever vaccine FAQ)

**Travel Prescriptions for Malaria prevention

- Chloroquine
- Doxycycline
- Atovaquone-Proguanil (Malarone®)
- Mefloquine (Lariam®)
