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Sexually Transmitted Disease Reporting

Reporting Requirements

- All Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, Pelvic Inflammatory Disease, Syphilis, Chancroid and Non-Gonococcal Urethritis must be reported to the Butte County Public Health Department (BCPHD).
- **Syphilis** must be reported by fax, telephone, or mail within **one working day** of identification.
- **Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, Pelvic Inflammatory Disease, Chancroid and Non-Gonococcal Urethritis** must be reported by fax, telephone, or mail within **seven working days** of identification.
- For each of the above Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STD's) submit a CMR to BCPHD. Please fill out the form completely including the patient's name, date of birth, address, and under remarks if the patient has been informed of diagnosis.
- Indicate the date of treatment and medication(s) prescribed. If the patient is a minor please provide school in attendance whenever possible.
- Indicate if partner(s) were treated as well. Include the date of treatment and the medication prescribed.
- For all Gonorrhea cases a Provider Report Form (PRF) must be submitted in addition to the CMR, as part of the California Enhanced Gonorrhea Surveillance System.
- Please inform patient that that the Health Department may be contacting them for routine follow-up.

BCPHD Follow-up

Follow-up will be conducted by the BCPHD for any of the above diseases and all cases will be reported to the California Department of Public Health (CDPH). Follow-up may include; a call to the provider from a Public Health staff member to submit a completed CMR (based on a positive lab report which was received), or a request for additional information which may not have been included on a CMR. When appropriate, the patient may be contacted to determine if medication was taken properly, to offer additional education and resources, or to inquire about the notification status of the patient's partner(s). In some cases, resources for anonymous partner notification may be offered to the patient. All information will be kept confidential.

BCPHD Services

The Butte County Public Health Department can provide education and case management services. Educational materials may be provided as well as a referral for treatment when necessary. The Butte County Public Health Clinic provides free or low-cost STD testing and treatment, free condoms, and offers free or low cost HIV testing and counseling.
