

Quick Car Seat Check-up:



Does your child ride in the back seat?

The back seat is generally the safest place in a crash. All children under the age of 13 should ride in the back seat—away from air bags.

Does your child ride facing the right way?

Children must ride rear facing until 2 years old. When children using infant-only seat reach the highest weight for their seat, they must continue to ride rear-facing in a convertible seat until at least age 2.

Is the seat belt tight enough?

Use the right belt slot on the car seat. The seat belt must stay tight when securing the car seat. The belt retractor must be in the “locked” position. The car seat should not move more than 1” side to side at the belt path.

Is the harness snug on your child?

After adjusting the harness try to pinch the harness webbing along the length at the center of the shoulder. If you can pinch the harness webbing at the shoulder- then it’s too loose.

Does your child have the best protection possible?

Keep your child in a car seat with a full harness as long as possible, at least until 40 pounds. Choose a seat with the highest possible harness weight maximum for the longest use. Then use a belt-positioning booster seat which helps the lap and shoulder belt fit your child correctly.

Never Leave Your Child Alone...

A child in a parked vehicle can die of heatstroke in just a few minutes, even if the weather is mild. Kids can also release brakes, start cars and face other dangers. Never leave your child alone in a car, even for a few minutes, and keep the doors and trunk locked at all times so children can’t play inside.

The Law

Children must ride in a safety seat or booster seat in the back seat until at least age 8.

Children must ride rear-facing until they are 2 years.

Children at least age 8 and less than 16 years must ride in a safety seat, booster, or properly fitted vehicle seat belt.

Children under age 6 cannot be left unattended in a vehicle unless supervised by someone 12 or older. A parking lot is as dangerous as a street!

La Ley

Niños deben viajar en un asiento de seguridad o asiento elevador en el asiento trasero hasta por lo menos 8 años de edad.

Los niños deben viajar mirando hacia atrás hasta los 2 años de edad.

Niños que tienen por lo menos 8 años de edad y son menores de 16 años deben viajar en un asiento de seguridad, asiento Booster, o con el cinturón de seguridad del vehículo ajustado apropiadamente.

Niños menores de 6 años de edad no pueden ser dejados dentro de un vehículo a menos que estén supervisados por una persona que tenga 12 años de edad o mayor. ¡Recuerden un estacionamiento de vehículo es igual de peligroso que en una calle!
