

RESTITUTION CHECKLIST
(mileage rates effective 01/01/21)

Maintain a list of any and all economic losses that you have incurred as a result of this crime. Please provide our office with a copy of your list and any supporting documentation including receipts, bills and photographs of injuries and/or damage. Always keep copies for yourself. If your losses are not eligible for court-ordered restitution, you may wish to seek an attorney's assistance to determine other remedies available to you.

Property Loss (defined as the replacement cost of like property or cost of repair when repair is possible)	\$
Medical Expenses (prescriptions, doctor bills, hospital bills, including any future expenses)	\$
Dental Expenses (dental work needed as result of the crime)	\$

Home or Vehicle Modifications (anything that must be done as a result of the crime to aid victim)	\$

* Interest accrues on the unpaid restitution order at the rate of 10% per annum. The judge decides whether interest accrues from the date of loss or the date the offender is sentenced. PC 1202.4(f)(3)(G). Maintaining accurate records, including the date and amount of partial payments received is encouraged. Restitution is non-dischargeable in bankruptcy and it remains an enforceable order until it is paid in full.
