ADULT SERVICES

Ages: 18 and over

Outpatient Centers

- Provides assessment, diagnosis, and treatment to individuals requiring mental health or dual diagnosis treatment. These services may include: medication support, individual counseling, group counseling, and connection to vocational training and housing.

SEARCH (Support, Employment, Assistance, Recovery, Consumer Housing)

- Provides the highest level of outpatient services to individuals who are homeless or at-risk of homelessness. Includes frequent psychiatric appointments, medication support and delivery, and in-home services support the individual in their recovery and wellness.

Wellness and Recovery Centers

- Consumer driven and recovery oriented activities that include peer support, socialization opportunities, life skill groups, reintegration into the community, and employment services.

CalWorks

- Partnership with the Butte County Department of Employment and Social Services (DESS) that provides individuals and families with counseling/treatment services for behavioral health challenges that may hinder someone's ability to enter the workforce.

AB 109

- AB 109 Provides assessment, diagnosis, and treatment to individuals requiring mental health or dual diagnosis treatment in order to support the reduction of recidivism and transition back into the community from incarceration. These services include: individual and group counseling, Wellness Recovery Action Plan (WRAP), Moral Recognition Therapy (MRT), and other supportive services.

YOUTH SERVICES

Ages 0 to 17 and 16 to 25

Outpatient Centers

- Provides treatment and care for behavioral and emotional needs of children, transitional age youth (TAY), and families. Services include group, individual, and family therapy; case management; medication support; and skill building.

Youth Intensive Program (YIP)

Culturally specific supportive services and more intensive care for youth and families experiencing severe emotional and behavioral challenges whom are at risk of homelessness and/or psychiatric hospitalizations. Services include individual and family therapy, case management, skill building and regular family check ins.

Youth Empowerment Services (YES)

- A referral based program that provides youth social rehabilitation opportunities through small and large group experiences. Services include leadership development and outdoor activities.

Programs and services may vary depending on location, so contact the center in your community (listed below) for more information.

Additional services are provided through community-based organizations. These services can be provided when you call your community center.

CRISIS SERVICES

All ages

Crisis Stabilization Unit - CSU

- Connects individuals 24 hours a day, 7 days a week (24/7) to a mental health professional for telephone intervention, information, or referrals. Staff provide evaluation and assistance in resolving crises.

Mobile Crisis Team- MCT

- In collaboration with Chico Police Department, the MCT provides support to youth and adults who are experiencing a mental health crisis in the community.

Crisis Response Team

- Provides support and evaluation to those experiencing a mental health crisis. Services provided on site (walk in), in the local emergency rooms and some school settings.

Psychiatric Health Facility

- A 16-bed, 24-hour acute facility providing a safe environment for adults needing care for their mental health challenge.

Crisis Residential Facility- Iris House

- The Crisis Residential Program is a homelike, temporary (up to 30 days), therapeutic environment where adult (18 and older) community members struggling with a mental health issue can receive 24 hour support and services.

Crisis Triage Connect

- Provides discharge planning services to those individuals placed in a psychiatric health facility. Provides a warm hand off between inpatient and outpatient levels of care by providing short term case management services.

SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER SERVICES

Ages: 12 and over

Medication Assisted Treatment

- Using medication (Suboxone, Vivitrol) coupled with outpatient counseling and behavioral therapies, to provide a whole person approach to the treatment of substance use disorders related to central nervous system depressants.

Outpatient Treatment

- Includes assessment, diagnosis, and treatment to individuals facing substance abuse challenges. Individual and group treatment and referral to community resources and self-help groups.

Stepping Stones

- Stepping Stones is an outpatient program that offers Drug/Alcohol treatment to women who are pregnant, parenting children, or working towards reunification. Cooperative Childcare and Transportation are provided. The program provides comprehensive, strength-based, family centered treatment for mothers seeking recovery from addiction. Stepping Stones is guided by a philosophy that embraces hope, respect, and support; empowering women to transform their lives and become healthy role models for their families and their community.

Drug Court

- Adult Drug Court is a collaborative court which partners with law enforcement to provide treatment to adult offenders who suffer from substance use disorder. This is a voluntary program that provides structure by linking supports and treatment with ongoing judicial oversight and treatment team case management.

Youth Treatment

- Includes assessment, diagnosis, and outpatient treatment for youth who are otherwise unable to access services for a primary substance use disorder. Services are offered in the field for youth.

PREVENTION SERVICES

Ages: 12-25

Friday Night Live and Club Live

- A youth led action group that meets on high school and junior high campuses to build leadership skills, broaden their social network and initiative projects that improve school climate, reduce youth access to alcohol, and promote social and emotional health.

Impact Mentoring

- Matches high school students with junior high school students in an ongoing supervised mentoring relationship to improve academic performance, develop leadership skills, and navigate personal challenges through a solution focused approach.

The Live Spots

- Oroville and Gridley's Youth Centers that provide safe, supportive services for young people in the areas of academic achievement, leadership and life skill development, employment and job readiness, promotion and fostering of mental health, and mobilizing schools and the community to reduce the stigma of mental health issues.

Youth Nexus

- Countywide youth grant making board that funds youth led projects to reduce access to alcohol, reduce stigma and discrimination and promote wellness, self-esteem and mental health.

Committed

- Committed Programs encourage people to live a healthy lifestyle and prevent youth access to alcohol. There are four main Committed Programs: Athlete Committed, Merchant Committed, Parent Committed, and Physician Committed.

Strengthening Families Program

- Designed for families to support techniques for communication, building strengths and life skills, increasing positive and effective parenting, handling emotions and managing stress, and setting limits and showing love.

Reach for the Future Conference

- Based on a Youth Development framework, providing leadership skills, support, and opportunities for young people.

Youth Development Summit

- Participants become advocates for: ending underage drinking, how to improve their school campus climate, reduce bullying and harassment, and reduce the stigma associated with depression and isolation.
