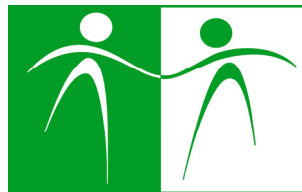

VICTIMS BILL OF RIGHTS

California citizens voted to provide victims of crimes with certain constitutional rights as defined under Article 1, Section 28 of the California Constitution - Marsy's Law.

RESTITUTION

The Butte County District Attorney's Office assists with the collection of fines and restitution orders from criminal offenders and, in turn, funds compensation for crime victims.

VICTIM ADVOCACY

The Victim & Witness Assistance Center has trained and experienced Victim Advocates to work with victims, witnesses and their families throughout and beyond the criminal justice process. The Center serves as the liaison between the victims, prosecutor, law enforcement and other criminal justice agencies. It is important to the Center that victims are treated fairly and remain an integral part of the proceedings.

VICTIM OF CRIME COMPENSATION PROGRAM

If you or a member of your family sustained injury as a direct result of a crime, you may be eligible to receive financial assistance through the California Victims Compensation Program.

The following losses may be covered:

- Medical/Dental
- Mental Health Counseling
- Wage/Income Loss
- Emergency Funeral/Burial
- Job Retraining
- Emergency Relocation
- Crime Scene Clean Up
- Home Security
- Home or Vehicle Modifications for Disabled Crime Victims
- Medically necessary equipment including wheelchairs, walkers, eye glasses, hearing aids and prosthetic devices.

Losses **NOT** covered under VOC:

- Personal property losses, including cash
- Pain and suffering

Though not covered under the VOC program, these losses may be recoverable through court-ordered restitution during the defendant's sentencing or a civil lawsuit.
